Logline

In the shadowy heart of Vienna, a cybersecurity analyst's mission to debunk psychics is derailed when an alluring medium conjures visions of his dead twin brother. As he investigates her mysterious abilities and wrestles with his own guilt, can he tell reality from illusion?

Synopsis

A compulsive skeptic haunted by his twin's suicide, cybersecurity analyst Jim Knight channels his grief into exposing psychics online (a pursuit encouraged by his rationalist friends). But when he encounters Maiya, a mysterious mystic who grants him an impossible reunion with his dead brother, Jim's rigid materialism begins to crack. As Jim pursues a scientific investigation of Maiya's abilities, he finds himself drawn into increasingly surreal experiences that challenge his understanding of reality and himself. Jim's obsessive quest for proof blinds him to mounting signs of danger, leading to catastrophic consequences at work and the loss of his closest relationships.

Themes

Through Jim's journey from cynical debunker to unwitting mystic, *The User Illusion* explores how grief, love and the limitations of human perception shape our experience. It also asks profound questions of our time: How do we construct our understanding of truth? What role do media and technology play in this process? At its heart, *The User Illusion* is a deeply personal story about the limitations of pure reason in the face of loss, and how our desperate need for certainty can blind us to deeper truths.
